
### What is a Prophet?

The ordinary Hebrew word for prophet is *nabi*, derived from a verb signifying "to bubble forth" like a fountain. A prophet was a spokesman for God; he spoke in God's name and by his authority. He is the mouth by which God speaks to men, and hence what the prophet says is not of man but of God.

The biblical prophets spoke the truth which came from God. Their unique vocation allowed them to authoritatively speak on God's behalf. They never spoke on their own authority, nor did they share their own opinions. They only shared their message as God instructed them. Their role was to make God's will known, as well as his holiness, and to instruct God's people to reject idolatry and sin.

### Major and Minor Prophets

The Bible uses the terms *major* and *minor* as a way to divide the prophetic books of the Old Testament. The Major Prophets are described as "major" because of the longer lengths of their books, not their significance. The Major Prophets are Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, and Daniel.



The Minor Prophets of the Bible are shorter books. They were just as significant as the Major Prophets, despite the title of minor. The Minor Prophets are Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi. The Minor Prophets are also sometimes called The Twelve.


The Prophets are typically the least popular for Christians to study or read. This is due to the difficult and unusual prophetic language. There are constant warnings and condemnation of either God's people going astray, or what will happen to those who choose to reject God. However, there is valuable truth in each book.

As with every part of the Bible, the Major and Minor Prophets shouldn't be skipped over. In fact, these books give us some of the richest glimpses of Christ that we see in the entire Old Testament. If you're looking for a better understanding of the Messiah and the events that led to and foretold his coming, the Major and Minor prophets are must-reads.



## Consultation on Assisted Suicide

Ottawa announced the consultation process on January 13 as it amends the Criminal Code to permit greater access to assisted suicide. The amendments are in response to a Quebec court decision last September that struck down parts of the existing law as unconstitutional. The consultation asks Canadians to weigh in on how far to extend access to medical assistance in dying, specifically whether assisted suicide and euthanasia should be expanded to include advance directives, mature minors and people who wish to end their lives solely because of mental illness.

## Consultation du gouvernement fédéral sur l'aide médicale à mourir

Le gouvernement du Canada a lancé une consultation publique sur l'élargissement de l'admissibilité au suicide assisté et à l'euthanasie. Cette consultation se fait suite à la décision de la Cour supérieure du Québec, qui a conclu qu'il est inconstitutionnel de limiter l'accès à l'AMM uniquement aux personnes en fin de vie. Les questions du sondage ne demandent pas si l'euthanasie ou le suicide assisté devraient être élargis pour y inclure les personnes handicapées; cette question est sous-entendue. Il y a cependant de l'espace dans le sondage pour exprimer des inquiétudes concernant l'élargissement de l'accès à l'euthanasie et souligner le besoin urgent d'y avoir des options alternatives viables, comme un meilleur financement public et un meilleur appui aux soins palliatifs, aux soins à domicile et aux « hospices ».
